What is the Optimist International Junior Golf Championships?

The Optimist International Junior Golf Championships (OIJGC) is one of the premier tournaments in the world for junior golfers (boys & girls) from 10 years old to 18 years old. Over 5,000 junior golfers will compete in local and District tournaments for the opportunity to be among the 700 junior golfers (including at-large entries from over 20 countries) who will compete in the International tournament held each year at PGA National Resort & Spa in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida. This year's tournament will be held July 19-29, 2007. Former winners of Optimist International sponsored tournaments include Tiger Woods, Ernie Els, Justin Leonard, Davis Love III, Michelle McGann, and PGA Tour rookie Jeff Overton, from Evansville.

When is the District Qualifying Tournament?

The District Tournament will be held at Deer Creek Golf Club in Clayton, Indiana on June 14, 2007 (10-11 and 12-13 year old age groups) and June 15, 2007 (14-15 and 16-18 year old age groups). Entries and sponsorships are due as soon as possible, but no later than June 4, 2007. For more information, check out the **new District Tournament** website (www.optimistindiana/projects/jrgolf).

How can my Club Participate?

Local Optimist Clubs can participate in one or more of the following ways:

- 1. <u>Hold a local Junior Golf Tournament</u>. Contact District Junior Golf Chair Mike Woodward for rules and tips on running your tournament.
- 2. **Sponsor a District Participant**. Even if you do not hold a local tournament, sponsor one or more junior golfers from your community by paying their entry fee (\$55.00) into the District Tournament which will be held at Deer Creek Golf Club in Clayton on June 14-15, 2007. Download the entry flyer from the District Tournament website (www.optimistindiana/projects/jrgolf).
- 3. **Be a District Tournament Sponsor**. District Tournament Sponsors make it possible for the District to send four participants (winning boy and girl in the two oldest age groups) to the International Tournament. Since we typically have about 20 participants qualify for and enter the International Tournament, the District also sends a volunteer to be a resource person / chaperone for participants and their families from our District. Tournament sponsorship opportunities range from \$55.00 to sponsor a participant to \$200.00 for a prominent hole or activity. Download the Sponsorship Opportunities flyer from the District Tournament website (www.optimistindiana/projects/jrgolf).
- 4. <u>Contact your local High School (boys & girls) Golf Coaches</u>. Let your local coaches know about the opportunities available for their players to participate in our program. District Tournament dates are structured to avoid conflicts with High School seasons. Be sure to give them one or more entry flyers.
- 5. <u>Contact your Local Golf Course Professional</u>. Let the Golf Professionals at your local courses know about our program. Ask them to distribute entry flyers to juniors who may be participating in a program at their course. Refer them to the District Tournament website (www.optimistindiana/projects/jrgolf).
- 6. Send one or more volunteers to help at the District Tournament. Approximately 30 volunteers are needed to help on the District Tournament playing dates. Some volunteer positions require a basic knowledge of golf, but many jobs just require a willing volunteer. Contact District Junior Golf Chair Mike Woodward (miwoodwardiu@vahoo.com) to volunteer.
- 7. Have a Junior Golf Program Presentation at a Club Meeting. District Junior Golf Chair Mike Woodward, District Junior Golf Assistant Chair Don Carrell, and District Junior Golf Committee Member John Harding are available to speak about the Junior Golf Program at a Club meeting. A & A REPORTS - TO ALL CLUB SECRETARIES AND PRESIDENTS:

2nd Quarter A&A reports must be inputted on the District website no later than 4/10/07.

We are still working on improvements to the form. As of now it's pretty much the same as it was last quarter, except that all the numbers go in the 2nd quarter column.

The instructions below were sent to you prior to first guarter submittal. Revisions for this guarter are in **BOLD**.

Go to www.optimistindiana.org, click on A&A FORM.

Click drop down menu and select your Club, put your Club number in as your password

Click "Go To This Selected Club"

Click "Review or Make Changes to your clubs A&A Form"

Review the data in the header concerning your Club. If there's a problem let me know.

Insert your Club membership total in the block next to "March 31"

From here on, all checks must go in the "Total Second Qtr" column ONLY

Go to Para. A

Items A.1 through A.5, check "Yes" on ONE line only. Items A.6 and A7. check "Yes" if appropriate

Go to Para. B

Item B.1, check 0, 1, or 2 as appropriate.

Items B.2 and B.3, check the number of activities in the "Total **Second** Qtr" column, then list the activities and the number of kids served in the large box under "List Activities Below", **after deleting all 1st quarter info in those boxes.** USE A SEPARATE LINE FOR EACH ACTIVITY.

e.g.: 1. Tri-Star Football, 75

2. Coloring contest, 110

If there is not enough room in the boxe(s) to list all activities, shorten the descriptions by abbreviating.

(At this point in time the "Number of Youth Served each Quarter" boxes may not allow you to put the correct total in. If this is the case, check again before **you submit the form** and if still true, ignore and I will add the totals up from the Activities boxes.)

I believe the rest of the form is self explanatory, except for Para C. 14. The present drop down boxes cannot cover all the possibilities. Ignore this Para for now. For now, do the calculation and click on the nearest "100".

And obviously, Para. F does not apply until the 4th quarter.

When finished, put your name in the box at the bottom of the form. The totals will be added automatically.

If you make changes click "Re-Calculate".

AND BE SURE TO CLICK "SAVE WORK"

- You will need a photo ID and certified birth certificate (your birth certificate will be returned to you with your passport)
- Do not sign the application until you get to the post office
- Make sure you check your passport for accuracy when received

Recommendations for incoming Optimist Club Presidents

Dear Incoming Club President -

I promised our incoming Club President some time ago that I would make some recommendations as to their year as President of our Optimist club. I am sure other Past Presidents can add their two cents worth but here are mine!

- 1. Select chairs of the key Optimist committees BEFORE you take the reins as President. These key committees are:
- a. Membership This is very important as we need to maintain and hopefully increase our membership. Membership recruiting does not just happen, it has to be emphasized constantly. We should have at least one organized membership recruiting drive. Usually this means having a NOW (New Optimists Wanted) meeting with incentives to recruit new members.
 - b. Program. We usually have good programs but they do not happen by accident.
 - c. Projects This is the way we spend our money to help the kids in our community.
- d. Oratorical contest Appoint this chair now so they can contact the speech teachers in local schools before school starts to include the contest in their curriculum.
 - e. Essay Ditto!
 - f. Newsletter A regular newsletter is important for member communication.
- g. Scrapbook A past president always appreciates a scrapbook of his/her year as president. Enter in the District competition..
 - h. Nomination I recommend that to be on this committee, you must be Past President!
- i. Publicity Our members and others like to read in local newspaper what happened at our meetings and projects!
- 2. Set aside a meeting in September where incoming committee chairs briefly promote their committee and ask for Optimist members to be on their respective committee. I recommend that we take one meeting in September do this! Contact current program chair now to get this scheduled!
- 3. Set the date for installation as President. Invite the incoming Lt. Governor. Make it a nite of celebration of past year accomplishments ad well as a preview of the coming year. Coordinate program with outgoing President.
- 4. I recommend that written invitations be sent by U.S. mail to all members homes for the installation banquet. As big a fan I am of email, I still think that a paper invitation is better for such an important event.
- 5. Attend all district meetings. This is required to be an Honor club and I feel that should be your minimum goal!

That is all that I can think of right now.

In summary, plan ahead and you will have a successful year. If you follow this tenet of the Optimist Creed, "To think only of the best, to work only for the best and to expect only the best," you will have a GREAT Optimist year!


